| 1 | Start at 300 W. 1st St. and find the plaza that depicts scenes of Rome and is named after a Rome commissioner. What is his nickname? | |
| 2 | Walk to corner of Broad St. & 3rd Ave. Cross 3rd Ave. and continue ahead on Broad Street until you find the ordinary bicycle shop located on what locals call the Cotton Block. When cotton was king, boats docked at the Etowah River, to deliver cotton and wagons lined the block to load the cotton. Look around for the official name of this block from when it was built in 1879. | |
| 3 | Continue south and cross the South Broad St. Bridge over the Etowah River. What year did General John Sevier conquer Kingfisher in battle? | |
| 4 | Cross Branham Ave. to Myrtle Hill which is one of Rome's Seven Hills and was established in 1857. How many steps are in the original entrance to the cemetery? <i>(Bonus point: Take a selfie from the top of the stairs with Downtown Rome in the background. Post on your Facebook or Instagram with the tag #RomeGeorgia)</i> | |
| 5 | Cross Broad St., head back to the bridge walking north on Broad Street. Look for the location that was once the site of Rome's Noble Foundry destroyed by General Sherman in 1864. The foundry manufactured cannons, steam engines and other machines. What is the name of the 25-ton locomotive built in Rome that was one of the 1st railroad locomotives south of Richmond? | |
| 6 | Continue along Broad St. and cross 2nd Ave. to the next block. Locate the T. Fahy building. What is the name of the business located in this building? | |
| 7 | Walk to corner of Broad St. & 3rd Ave. In 1910, President Theodore Roosevelt gave a speech right here at this corner where the Women of the Confederacy Monument was located. The monument was once located at this street corner but was relocated to Rome's famous cemetery you just visited, what is the name of this cemetery? | |
| 8 | Cross 3rd Ave. and make a right to 3rd Ave. Rome's founders fell in love with the hills and rivers in Rome. Georgia Legislature made Rome an official city in 1835. Find the location where it is noted that Rome was a good location for a town. How many men are attributed to the founding of Rome? | |

| 1 | Start at the Town Green. The town green sits on the Oostanoola River and merges with the Etowah River (which is 163 miles long) to form the Coosa. What is the original Cherokee name of the Etowah River? | |
| 2 | Take Heritage trail going in the direction that the river flows. In an effort to repopulate a rare sport fish that dates to the age of the dinosaurs, anglers are encouraged to release this fish back into the river. What is the name of the fish? | |
| 3 | Continue moving ahead along the trail. Find the footbridge which once rotated on its central pier to allow steamboats to pass. As Georgia's first Rails to Trails project in 1976, the engineered structure makes for great photos. <i>(Bonus point: Take a selfie on the bridge and post it on your Facebook or Instagram with the tag: #RomeGeorgia)</i> | |
| 4 | Move forward across the bridge. Find the large bolder in Heritage Park. What namesake flower represents the group who maintains the memorial garden? | |
| 5 | Follow the Heritage Trail that loops under the bridge you just crossed and find the pedestrian bridge upstream. There were two Indian Chiefs who operated ferries in Rome. Find the spot that recognizes the Indian Chief who operated a ferry at the headwaters of the Coosa. What is the name of this chief? | |
| 6 | Now look around and locate Ellen Axson Wilson; she grew up in Rome and was the first wife of President Woodrow Wilson. What is she doing? | |
| 7 | Stay on the same side of the river, but follow the trail in the opposite direction that the river is flowing. Head north past the John Ross Memorial Bridge following the trail along the river. The City of Rome is a Purple Heart City. There are many places throughout Rome that honor veterans, including our trails. Find the veteran memorial along the trail. What is it called? | |
| 8 | Keep moving ahead on the trail which turns into a boardwalk that connects the Heritage Trail across the river to the library and Ridge Ferry Park. The flood stage of the Oostanoola River is 25 feet; but how many total feet does the river need to rise for it to touch the bottom of the 5th avenue bridge? | |

| 1 | Find the Masonic Temple located on Broad Street between 3rd and 4th Ave. This building was burned by union soldiers by the orders of General Sherman during the civil war. What group of men sent contributions for the rebuilding of the lodge? | |
| 2 | Continue walking just a little further down this block and find the tribute recognizing "The Woman Who Saved Football in Georgia". What is her full name? | |
| 3 | Cross 4th Ave. and continue up Broad St. Locate the barber shop pole. Once a luxury hotel, and named for a confederate general, this building now houses event space and apartments. It was originally the location of the Choice Hotel which was the social and political center of activity for many years. What name is printed on the double doors of this building? | |
| 4 | Look across the street and find the dancing flower. What is the name of the person who this sculpture was inspired by? <i>(Bonus Point: Take a selfie of you doing your favorite dance pose in front of the flower; post it on your Facebook or Instagram with the tag: #RomeGeorgia)</i> | |
| 5 | Continue straight and find the theatre. This theatre was designed as a "talkie" theater and was the first venue in the South to be designed and built for sound pictures. What theatre in New York is it modeled after? | |
| 6 | Continue straight to cross 6th Ave. and make a left to cross Broad St. Locate the Admiral John Henry Tower monument at the corner. In 1919, what ocean was he the first to cross in one of the most daring and momentous flights in aviation history? | |
| 7 | Continue ahead on the sidewalk along Broad St. Locate the Capitoline Wolf, an exact replica of the Etruscan art in Rome, Italy, it was gifted by old Rome to new Rome. What year was the statue gifted? | |
| 8 | Walk to the corner of Broad St. and 5th Ave. Cross over 5th Ave and make a right onto 5th Ave. Locate the courthouse, built in 1892 and still serves as the County Courthouse today. How many clock faces are on the bell tower of the courthouse? | |
